

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
January 7, 2014**

A meeting of the Pennington County Board of Commissioners was held Tuesday, January 7, 2014, in the Commissioners' meeting room of the Pennington County Courthouse. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, Ken Davis, Don Holloway and Nancy Trautman.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Auditor Julie Pearson opened the floor for nominations for Chairperson.

Commissioner Trautman nominated Lyndell Petersen and Commissioner Buskerud nominated Ken Davis for Chairperson. Roll Call Vote (by name): Commissioner Buskerud voted for Davis, Commissioner Davis voted for Davis; Commissioner Holloway voted for Petersen; Commissioner Petersen voted for Petersen; Commissioner Trautman voted for Petersen. Lyndell Petersen was elected chairperson on a 3-2 vote.

Chairperson Petersen opened the floor for nominations for Vice Chairperson.

Commissioner Holloway nominated Nancy Trautman for Vice Chairperson. MOVED by Davis and seconded by Holloway that nominations cease and a unanimous ballot be cast for Commissioner Trautman for Vice Chairperson. Vote: Unanimous.

ADOPT RULES OF ORDER WITH EXCEPTIONS

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holloway to adopt Roberts Rules of Order, 10th Edition, but not to adopt the portion that precludes discussion of issues by the Chair or precludes the Chair from voting except where there is a tie vote. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Holloway to adopt the amended Pennington County Board of Commissioners' Policy Regarding Reconsideration of Action Taken by the Board. Vote: Unanimous.

ESTABLISH COMMISSIONERS SALARY

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Trautman to set the 2014 salary for Commissioners at \$1250 per month or \$15,000 per year. Substitute motion: MOVED by Davis and seconded by Buskerud to leave the salary at the current rate of \$1200 per month. The substitute motion failed 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes; Davis – yes; Holloway – no; Trautman – no; Petersen – no. The original motion carried 4-1 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes; Davis – no; Holloway – yes; Trautman – yes; Petersen – yes.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holloway to continue Item 20, Special Approval of Vouchers/Expenses under Items from Emergency Management, to the January 21, 2014, meeting and approve the agenda as amended. Vote: Unanimous.

**RESOLUTION
DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE ACT
CERTIFICATION FOR A PUBLIC ENTITY**

1. The County of Pennington Certifies that it will provide a drug-free workplace by:
 - a. Publishing a statement notifying employees that unlawfully manufacturing, distributing, dispensing, possessing or using a controlled substance in the recipient's workplace is prohibited and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation or such prohibition.
 - b. Establishing a drug-free awareness program to inform employees about:
 1. The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 2. The recipient's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;

3. Any drug counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs that are available; and
 4. The penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace.
 - c. Making it a requirement that each employee to be engaged in the performance of the grant or cooperative agreement be given a copy of the statement required by paragraph (a).
 - d. Notifying the employee in the statement required by paragraph (a) that, as a condition of employment under the grant or cooperative agreement, the employee will;
 1. Abide by the terms of the statement; and,
 2. Notify the employer of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five days after such a conviction.
 - e. Notifying the federal sponsoring agency within ten days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d) (2), with respect to any employee so convicted;
 1. Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
 2. Requiring such an employee to participate satisfactorily in drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
 - f. Taking one of the following actions, within 30 days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee so convicted;
 1. Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
 2. Requiring such an employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State or local health, law enforcement, or other agency.
 - g. Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).

Vote: Unanimous.
- B. Public Depository Liability Quarterly Report (SDCL CH4-6A): MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Holloway to recognize the Treasurer’s Public Depository Liability Quarterly Report, which is available in the office of the Pennington County Treasurer and on the web site of the South Dakota Department of Legislative Audit. Vote: Unanimous.
- C. Delinquent Mobile Home List: MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Davis to table the Delinquent Mobile Home List until later in the meeting. Vote: Unanimous.

- B.
