

**PENNINGTON COUNTY

February 18, 2014**

A meeting of the Pennington County Board of Commissioners was held Tuesday, February 18, 2014, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Pennington County Courthouse. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, Ken Davis, Don Holloway and Nancy Trautman.

**APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holloway to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

AND WHEREAS, said petitions indicate the desire of all qualified voters and landowners within the proposed boundaries to organize the SKY-VUE RANCH ROAD District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, that the Pennington County Commission acknowledge and declare the SKY-VUE RANCH ROAD District to be organized

and established as a governmental subdivision of the State of South Dakota and a public body, corporate and political to be effective as of today's date with taxing authority for the 2014 pay 2015 tax year and after.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that the SKY-VUE RANCH ROAD District be described as follows: LOT 2, 3 & 4 OF TRACT 1R OF HART RANCH WEST #2 SUBDIVISION; LOT 1 & 2 OF SUDBURY RANCH SUBDIVISION; S396' OF NW1/4SE1/4; S1/2SE1/4 OF SECTION 21, T1S, R7E AND SECTION 28 LESS HART RANCH WEST #1, LESS HART RANCH WEST #2 AND LESS ROW OF T1S, R7E, BHM, Pennington County, SD.

**LIEN RELEASE REQUESTS (Names withheld per SDCL 28-13-42)**

- A. E.B. & W.B.: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to ask Credit Collections Bureau to stop collection actions and further moved to deny the lien release request for EB for accounts totaling \$108.95 and \$9755.09, and EB and WB totaling \$5166.51. Commissioner Petersen announced that he would recuse himself from this vote. The motion carried with four affirmative votes.
- B. PF: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Holloway to approve the lien release request for PF in the amount of \$79.75. Vote: Unanimous.
- C. CE Settlement Request: MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Trautman to have Director of Health & Human Services Karen Romey continue to work with the protective payee of CE to negotiate a settlement of the outstanding balance with an \$8,000 payment to Pennington County and further moved to bring the lien release for the remaining balance of \$17,003.22 back to the Board for approval. Vote: Unanimous.

**BRIDGE REINSPECTION PROGRAM RESOLUTION  
FOR USE WITH SDDOT RETAINER CONTRACTS**

WHEREAS, Title 23, Section 151, *United States Code* and Title 23, Part 650, Subpart C, *Code of Federal Regulations*, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years.

THEREFORE, Pennington County is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.

The County requests SDDOT to hire Interstate Engineering Inc. (Consulting Engineers) for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered and bill the County for 20% of the cost. The County will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.

MOVED by Davis and seconded by Buskerud to convene as the Board of Adjustment. Vote: Unanimous.

- A. VARIANCE / VA 14-01: Larry Shorb, Clifford and Mary Shorb; John Preston – Agent. To reduce the minimum required lot size from 40 acres to 11 acres in a General Agriculture District in accordance with Sections 205 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Located on the following metes and bounds description: Commencing from the South 1/4 corner of section 18, T2S, R8E, B.H.M., an original stone found in place, thence N89°46'13"W a distance of 1316.37' to a point, thence N0°05'55"E a distance of 873.53' to the southwest corner of proposed Lot 1 of John Deere Subdivision and Point of Beginning, thence N0°05'55"E along the 1/16 line a distance of 699.11' to the northwest corner of proposed Lot 1, thence S86°27'33"E a distance of 738.76' to the northeast corner of proposed Lot 1, thence S12°25'38"E a distance of 513.73' to the southeast corner of proposed Lot 1, thence S79°51'55"W along the north right of way of Murphy Road a distance of 862.57' to the Point of Beginning. - B. VARIANCE / VA 14-02: Rimrock Community Club; Mike Ryan – Agent. To reduce the minimum required setback distances and to waive the off-street parking requirements in a General Commercial District in accordance with Sections 209 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Tract V (less east 140.3 feet) of the SW1/4SE1/4, Section 31, T2N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Trautman to approve Variance / VA 14-02 with four (4) conditions. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That the existing on-site wastewater treatment system be fenced off or a physical barrier be placed around it in order to prevent parking or driving in the location of the septic tank and drainfield. Parking and driving in this area should also be prohibited during reconstruction of the Rimrock Community Center;
2. That approval of the Setback Variance portion of this request only applies for the construction of the new Rimrock Community Center. All other structures must maintain the proper setback requirements or obtain approval of a separate Variance; and
3. That the side access door be moved away from the drainfield area; and,
4. That if the existing foundation cannot be used for the new structure, the required setbacks must be met.
