

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
July 15, 2014**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, July 15, 2014, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Pennington County Courthouse. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, Ken Davis, Don Holloway and Nancy Trautman.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Davis to deny the request by George Ferebee to remove Item 18C, The Spring Creek Watershed Management and Project Implementation Plan. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Davis and seconded by Buskerud to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Holloway to appoint Sig Zvejnieks to serve a three-year term on the Planning Commission. The vote was unanimous on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes, Davis – yes, Holloway – yes, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Petersen to appoint Barb Landers to serve a three-year term on the Planning Commission. The vote was unanimous on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes, Davis – yes, Holloway – yes, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

ITEMS FROM AUDITOR

A. 2015 Pennington County Provisional Budget Presentation:

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Buskerud to remove \$45,000 from the County Fire budget designated for a new vehicle. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Trautman to dissolve the assigned reserve for the Health & Human Services Building in the amount of \$2,221,666.67 and the Equipment Reserve in the amount of \$46,487. Both will revert to the cash balance in the Accumulated Building fund for future projects yet to be determined. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Buskerud to lower the budget reserve percentage to 18% and further moved that the Board of Commissioners no longer grant supplements in the next budget year from over collected revenues and unspent budgets except in cases where unanticipated revenues are received that produce nonbudgeted expenses in the same year. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Davis to adopt the Provisional Budget in the amount of \$86,247,199 which includes Miscellaneous Revenues of \$40,853,963, Tax Revenues of \$36,543,340 Cash Reserves Applied in the amount of \$12,033,908 and the 5% Uncollected Tax Estimate of \$3,184,012. It was further moved to give notice that the Board of County Commissioners of Pennington County will meet in the Commissioners' Meeting Room located in the County Courthouse at 315 Saint Joseph Street, Rapid City, SD, on Tuesday, September 2, 2014, at 10 a.m. for the purpose of considering the Provisional Budget for the year 2015 and the various items, schedules, amounts and appropriations set forth therein and as many days thereafter as is deemed necessary until the final adoption of the budget on or before September 30, 2014. At such time any interested person may appear either in person or by a representative and will be given an opportunity for a full and complete discussion of all purposes, objectives, items, schedules, appropriations, estimates, amounts and matters set forth and contained in the Provisional Budget. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM TREASURER

A. Ability to Accept Payments for Property Taxes: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Buskerud to authorize the Treasurer to draft a Resolution and establish a procedure to accept monthly payments for property taxes, a process outlined in SDCL 10-21-7.1. Vote: Unanimous.

A. Abatements Applications – Gunderson & Shaffer:

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Trautman to deny the abatement for Wynn Gunderson for Owner Occupied status on Parcel 64369, a vacant lot.

Substitute motion: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Buskerud to continue the abatement request for Parcel ID 64369 to the next meeting so the State's Attorney can provide more information for the Board.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to amend the substitute motion to include the approval of the 2013 abatement/refund for Wynn A. Gunderson for Tax ID 64370 in the amount of \$3493.83, and the 2014 abatement/refund for Jay Shaffer, Tax ID 8006484 in the amount of \$93.96. Vote on the motion as amended: Unanimous.

Vote: Unanimous.

- A. VARIANCE / VA 14-20: Mark Anderson / Anderson Rentals, LLC. To reduce the minimum setback distance between units (mobile homes) from 20 feet to 16 feet in a mobile home park to allow for a mobile home to be moved on to the property in a north/south direction rather than an east/west direction in a Suburban Residential District in accordance with Sections 208, 305, and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lot F of Lot 8 less 153 x 127 TR in NW Corner, Plateau Subdivision, Section 10, T1N, R8E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

- 1) That this Variance only applies for the setback distances between the proposed mobile home and the neighboring mobile homes on Lots 2 and 5 to be reduced. All other structures must maintain the proper setbacks or obtain separate Variance(s) for that structure.

- B. VARIANCE / VA 14-21: James and Julie Smoragiewicz. To reduce the minimum required lot size from 40 acres to 3.75 acres in a General Agriculture District in accordance with Sections 205 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.
