

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
September 19, 2014**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Thursday, September 19, 2014, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Pennington County Courthouse. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, Ken Davis, Don Holloway and Nancy Trautman.

RESOLUTION TO REVISE THE
PENNINGTON COUNTY HIGHWAY SYSTEM**

WHEREAS, the Pennington County Board of Commissioners has determined that revisions to the County Primary Highway System are necessary to correct the data utilized by the South Dakota Department of Transportation, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Rapid City has jurisdiction of the following roads:

- 44TH ST: Beginning at Raider Rd, northwest to the section line between Sections 4 and 5 of T1N and R7E, for a distance of 0.18 miles.
- CAMBELL ST: Beginning at Jess St, south to E St Patrick St, including interchanges onto Omaha Street, for a distance of 1.30 miles.

- HAINES AVE: Beginning at the Rapid City boundary, south to Anamosa St, for a distance of 2.82 miles.
- LONG VIEW RD: Beginning 1.00 mile east of Radar Hill Rd, then north, east, and south to 0.17 miles east of the SW corner of Sec 9, T1N, R9E, for a distance of 1.82 miles.
- MALL DR: Beginning at N Maple Dr, east to Seger Dr, for a distance of 0.14 miles.
- N CAMBELL ST: Beginning at E North St, south to Jess St, for a distance of 0.34 miles.
- N ELK VALE RD: Beginning at Country Rd, south for a distance of 1.00 mile.
- N LACROSSE ST: Beginning at E Anamosa St, north to Seger Dr, for a distance of 1.03 miles.
- S CANYON RD: Beginning at 44th St, northwest to 213' northwest of Roubaix Dr, for a distance 0.72 miles.
- S VALLEY DR: Beginning at SD Hwy 44, south to E St Patrick St, for a distance of 0.21 miles.
- SEGER DR: Beginning at Mall Dr, east to Lacrosse St, for a distance of 0.40 miles.
- SHERIDAN LAKE RD: Beginning at SD Hwy 44, southwest to 270' south of Wildwood Dr for a distance of 3.34 miles.
- UNIVERSAL DR: Beginning at the Rapid City boundary, southeast to SD Hwy 445, for a distance of 0.33 miles.
- W CHICAGO ST: Beginning at SD Hwy 231, west to 44th St, for a distance of 0.67 miles, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Wall has jurisdiction of the following road:

- GLENN ST: Beginning at SD Hwy 240 in Wall, north to E 4th Ave, for a distance of 0.43 miles, and;

WHEREAS, the following roads are classified as Pennington County Secondary Roads:

- COUNTRY RD: Beginning at 143rd Ave, east to N Elk Vale Rd, for a distance of 2.00 miles.
- RESERVOIR RD: Beginning at Poker Dr, south to Twilight Dr, for a distance of 0.18 miles.

WEST GATE RD: Beginning at Country Rd, north for a distance of 0.52 miles.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Pennington County Board of Commissioners, that the above listed roads be DELETED from the Pennington County Primary Highway System, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Pennington County Board of Commissioners that the following roads not documented as Primary Highways by the SD Department of Transportation, be officially ADDED to the Pennington County Primary Highway System:

233RD ST: Beginning at 158th Ave, east to 161st Ave, for a distance of 3.01 miles.

CEDAR BUTTE RD: Beginning at the I90 Ramp, north to 233rd St for a distance of 0.47 miles.

LIBERTY BLVD: Beginning at Tower Rd, east and south to Hwy 1416 for a distance of 1.64 miles.

LONG VIEW RD: Beginning at SD Hwy 44, east to Reservoir Rd, for a distance of 0.45 miles.

OLD FOLSOM RD: Beginning at SD Hwy 79, east for a distance of 0.46 miles.

PLAYHOUSE RD: Beginning at Oak Meadows Rd, southwest to Custer County line, for a distance of 1.13 miles.

RADAR HILL RD: Beginning at SD Hwy 44, north to Morris Ln, for a distance of 0.35 miles.

RADAR HILL RD: Beginning at Mustang Ln, north to 229th St, for a distance of 1.46 miles.

RESERVOIR RD: Beginning at Long View Rd, south to SD Hwy 44, for a distance of 0.37 miles.

SPRING DRAW RD: Beginning at SD Hwy 44, south to Hart Table Rd, for a distance of 3.53 miles.

2015 Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant Application

WHEREAS, the Pennington County Commissioners have determined it is in the best interest of Pennington County to apply for a grant to offset the costs for upgrading the ramps in Rapid Valley; and

WHEREAS, many of the existing ramps are not in compliance with current ADA standards; and

WHEREAS, many intersection corners do not have any ramps; and

WHEREAS, the County Commissioners desire to provide the necessary infrastructure for pedestrian mobility for all County residents along County jurisdictional roads in Rapid Valley; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Commissioners authorize the Highway Department Superintendent to apply for a TAP grant for phase 1 of the ramp upgrades; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Commissioners are committed to providing funds for an 18.05% local match for phase 1 of the ramp upgrades, which is estimated at approximately \$27,758.
