

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
November 18, 2014**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, November 18, 2014, in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the County Administration Building at 130 Kansas City Street, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, Ken Davis and Don Holloway. Commissioner Nancy Trautman was not in attendance.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

MOVED by Holloway and seconded by Buskerud to move Item 20, Executive Session, to follow Items From the Highway Department and approve the agenda as amended. Vote: Unanimous.

11-18-2014 RESOLUTION
SOUTH INTERSTATE 90 SERVICE ROAD SPEED LIMIT

WHEREAS, the service road south of Interstate 90 has no posted speed limit; and

WHEREAS, the Pennington County Board of Commissioners have determined that it would be in the best interest of the residents of Pennington County that the speed zone be established at 40 miles per hour on the South Interstate 90 Service Road; and

WHEREAS, the Board has the authority to establish such speed zones on County roads pursuant to SDCL 32-25-9.1 and SDCL 7-18A-2;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the speed zone limiting the maximum speed of travel at 40 mph be established on the South Interstate 90 Service Road beginning at the intersection with Elk Vale Road, continuing east for a distance of 1.54 miles and ending at the termination of the public road.

1. Set-Back Variances for the existing residence and the proposed garage only apply for the areas illustrated on the site-plan and as described via the Metes and Bounds Description.
2. A new Floodplain Development Permit will need to be approved prior to the approval of a Building Permit for the detached garage.
3. The applicant will have two (2) years, from the date of approval of SV14-27 to obtain an approved Floodplain Development Permit and Building Permit for the proposed garage.
4. Within 240 days of the living room addition is added to the existing residence, the applicant must submit a surveyed as-built site-plan to the Planning Department.
5. Within 240 days of the proposed garage being built, the applicant must submit a surveyed as-built site-plan to the Planning Department.
6. Within 240 days of approval of Variance / VA 14-27 a separate setback variance be applied for and approved for the existing detached shed, or it be moved to a location on the property where it will meet the required setbacks, and a floodplain development permit be obtained if it is to be placed within the floodplain and floodway, or it be removed from the property.

1. That prior to filing the plat with the Register of Deeds, the Auditors Certificate be included on the plat;
2. That at the time Building Permits are applied for, for the subject properties, addresses will be assigned and said lot addresses shall be posted so they are clearly visible at all times in accordance with Pennington County's Ordinance #20;
3. That a Building Permit be obtained for any structure exceeding 144 square feet or located on a permanent foundation, which requires a site plan to be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director;
4. That, if construction within the 100-year Floodplain and/or Floodway boundary is desired, an approved Floodplain Development Permit and/or approved Letter of Map Revision or Amendment, from FEMA, is required prior to the issuance of a Building Permit;
5. That the applicant ensure that all natural drainage ways must be maintained and are not blocked; and,
6. That following platting of the proposed lot, any on-site wastewater treatment system be subject to the requirements of Section 204-J of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance, including the requirement to obtain an Operating Permit.
