

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
January 6, 2015**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, January 6, 2015, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building at 130 Kansas City Street, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners and Commissioners-elect present: Ron Buskerud, George Ferebee, Deb Hadcock and Nancy Trautman.

OATHS OF OFFICE

Presiding Judge Jeff Davis administered the oaths of office to Commissioners Ron Buskerud and Deb Hadcock.

Kenneth E. (Chuck) Jasper administered the oath of office to Commissioner George Ferebee.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Chairperson Lyndell Petersen opened the floor for nominations for chairperson.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Trautman to vote by ballot. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to vote by ballot without nominations. Vote: Unanimous.

The 2015 Chairperson is Lyndell Peterson on a 4-1 vote.
The 2015 Vice Chairperson is Deb Hadcock on a 3-2 vote.

ADOPT RULES OF ORDER WITH EXCEPTIONS

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to adopt Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, 11th Edition, including any updates or amendments thereto, but not to adopt the portion that precludes discussion of issues by the Chair or precludes the Chair from voting except where there is a tie vote. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Ferebee to adopt the Pennington County Board of Commissioners' Policy Regarding Reconsideration of Action Taken by the Board. Vote: Unanimous.

ESTABLISH COMMISSIONERS' SALARY

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Ferebee to set the 2015 salary for Commissioners at the same rate as 2014: \$1250 per month or \$15,000 per year. Vote: Unanimous.

Commissioner Buskerud left the meeting.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Ferebee to continue Item 18, Abatement Application for Ryan & Lauren Wiechmann, to the January 20, 2015, County Board meeting and approve the agenda as amended. Vote: Unanimous.

Commissioner Buskerud rejoined the meeting.

2015 RESOLUTION

DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE ACT CERTIFICATION FOR A PUBLIC ENTITY

1. The County of Pennington, SD certifies that it will provide a drug-free workplace by:
 - a. Publishing a statement notifying employees that unlawfully manufacturing, distributing, dispensing, possessing or using a controlled substance in the recipient's workplace is prohibited and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation or such prohibition.
 - b. Establishing a drug-free awareness program to inform employees about:
 1. The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 2. The recipient's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
 3. Any drug counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs that are available; and

4. The penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace.
 - c. Making it a requirement that each employee to be engaged in the performance of the grant or cooperative agreement be given a copy of the statement required by paragraph (a).
 - d. Notifying the employee in the statement required by paragraph (a) that, as a condition of employment under the grant or cooperative agreement, the employee will;
 1. Abide by the terms of the statement; and,
 2. Notify the employer of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five days after such a conviction.
 - e. Notifying the federal sponsoring agency within ten days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d) (2), with respect to any employee so convicted;
 1. Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
 2. Requiring such an employee to participate satisfactorily in drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
 - f. Taking one of the following actions, within 30 days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee so convicted;
 1. Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
 2. Requiring such an employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State or local health, law enforcement, or other agency.
 - g. Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).

End of Consent Agenda

LIEN RELEASE REQUEST (JS): MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Trautman to deny the lien release request for JS (Name withheld per SDCL 28-13-42). The motion carried with four affirmative votes. Chairperson Petersen recused himself from this item.

LIEN RELEASE REQUEST (TVS): MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to return the liens in the name of TVS (Name withheld per SDCL 28-13-42) from collections and encourage the applicant to make payments toward the outstanding balance. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM SHERIFF

- A. Corrections Doctor and Nurse Practitioner Positions: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Trautman to authorize the Sheriff to hire a part time, non-benefited physician/medical director at \$4,200 per month and a part-time benefited Nurse Practitioner at \$10,400 per month, with both positions classified as exempt. The motion carried 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – no, Ferebee - no, Hadcock – yes, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

ITEMS FROM STATE’S ATTORNEY

- A. Appointment of Alternate Representative to the Rushmore Regional Rail Authority: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to appoint Commissioner Ferebee to serve as the Alternate Representative for Pennington County to the Rushmore Regional Rail Authority. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM TREASURER

- A. Designation of Banks: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Ferebee to designate Wells Fargo Bank South Dakota, N.A. and First Interstate Bank as the primary active depositories for Pennington County pursuant to SDCL 7-20-13. Treasurer Janet Sayler noted that she may utilize other financial institutions for short-term investments throughout the year. Vote: Unanimous.
- B. Public Depository Liability Quarterly Report: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to recognize the Public Liability Quarterly Reports per SDCL 4-6A. Vote: Unanimous.
- C. Delinquent Mobile Homes List: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to acknowledge receipt of the list of all delinquent mobile home taxes as of December 31, 2014, pursuant to SDCL 10-22-31. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM BUILDINGS & GROUNDS

- A. Certification of Substantial Completion – Administration Building: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to authorize the Chairperson’s signature to the Certificate of Substantial Completion dated September 15, 2014, for the Administration Building, described as Package 3 in project documents for the Pennington County Campus Expansion Project Contract with J. Scull Construction Services, Inc. The motion carried 4-1 with Hadcock opposing.

DISCUSSION OF VACATION HOME RENTALS IN SUBURBAN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS, INCLUDING THE DEFINITION OF ‘TRANSFER’

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock that the Board of Commissioners review the Vacation Home Rental (VHR) Ordinance. The motion carried 4-1 with Buskerud opposing.

Former VHR committee members will be contacted to determine their interest in reviewing the new concerns.

PLANNING & ZONING ITEMS

- A. ROAD CONSTRUCTION WITHIN A SECTION LINE ROW / CS 14-03: Robert Taylor Family Trust; Gerry Eckert - Agent. To construct a road within the Section Line Right-of-Way in order to provide access to a lot in Section 27.

Located between Sections 27, 33, and 34, T1N, R7E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Trautman to rescind the December 2, 2014, approval of Road Construction Within a Section Line ROW / CS 14-03. Roll call vote: Buskerud – yes, Ferebee – yes, Hadcock – yes, Trautman – yes, Petersen - yes.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to approve Construction of a 14' road within a Section Line Right-of-Way CS 14-04 with eleven (11) conditions. The motion carried 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes, Ferebee – no, Hadcock – yes, Trautman – no, Petersen – yes.

1. That if the amount of disturbed area exceeds one (1) acre, a Department of Environment and Natural Resource's Storm Water Construction Permit and Rapid City Air Quality Permit is obtained prior to the start of any construction;
2. That erosion control measures be maintained and barrier protection measures (i.e. wattles, silt fence, etc.) be installed;
3. That dust control measures be implemented to prevent dust from leaving the site and impacting the adjacent properties and/or street(s);
4. That any necessary tracking control measures be implemented at the entrance to Moon Meadows Drive during the period of construction;
5. That any necessary culverts be installed in accordance with Ordinance #14 standards;
6. That the applicant pays for any regulatory, warning, and information road signs as determined by the County Highway Department;
7. That any disturbed areas shall be stabilized and re-vegetated as required in Section 507-A of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance;
8. That any fencing disturbed by construction of the road be moved and replaced as necessary by the applicant;
9. That any monuments establishing property boundaries be replaced as necessary, if disturbed by construction of the road;
10. That the turn-around is constructed prior to the issuance of a Building Permit on the SW¼ of Section 27, T1N, R7E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota; and
11. That this Construction within a Section Line Right-of-Way be reviewed in one (1) year.
