

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
January 20, 2015**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, January 20, 2015, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building at 130 Kansas City Street, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: George Ferebee, Deb Hadcock and Nancy Trautman; Commissioner Ron Buskerud joined by teleconference. Pursuant to SDCL 1-25-1.2, votes were taken by roll call.
