

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
July 21, 2015**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, July 21, 2015, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building at 130 Kansas City Street, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, George Ferebee, Deb Hadcock and Nancy Trautman.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following items have been placed on the Consent Agenda for action to be taken by a single vote of the Board of Commissioners. Any item may be removed from the Consent Agenda for separate consideration.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to remove Item 7 for separate consideration and approve the remainder of the Consent Agenda Items as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

6. Approve the minutes of the regular Board of Commissioners' meeting held July 7, 2015.
7. Removed for separate consideration.
8. Approval of the Proclamation recognizing September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month in Pennington County.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to approve the vouchers listed at the end of the minutes for expenditures for insurance, professional services, publications, rentals, supplies, repairs, maintenance, travel, conference fees, utilities, furniture and equipment totaling \$1,735,030.75. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee opposing.

APPLICATION FOR CONDEMNATION OF AN EASEMENT FOR AN ISOLATED TRACT – ACROPOLIS HOLDINGS: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to rescind the motion of June 16, 2015, “*that until such time as the applicant has acted with the City of Keystone, the Board of Commissioners’ actions are held in abeyance.*” The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee opposing.

A motion by Ferebee to request that the applicant approach the City of Keystone and get their definitive answer on where they stand on this issue died for lack of a second.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to continue the request for a month to determine if the property is an isolated tract and also the road jurisdiction. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee opposing.

- A. NEW RETAIL (ON-OFF SALE) MALT BEVERAGE LICENSE: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Petersen to approve the application for a new Retail (on-off sale) Malt Beverage license for Crooked Creek Resort, Crooked Creek Resort Inc. Vote: Unanimous.
- B. SPECIAL REQUEST FOR RETAIL ON-SALE MALT BEVERAGE AND WINE LICENSE: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to approve the Special Retail On-Sale Malt Beverage and Wine License for the Performing Arts Center of Rapid City. Vote: Unanimous.
- C. INTEREST DISTRIBUTION POLICY: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock that effective with fiscal year 2015, the distribution of interest earnings shall be recognized in the following funds: E911 if required by law and the County General Fund. Distribution of the earnings for the year will be calculated on the December 31 ending balance in each fund. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Ferebee to take a 10 minute recess. Vote: Unanimous. 10:53 a.m. The Board reconvened at 11:03 a.m.

- a. Provisional Budget Approval: A motion by Ferebee to approve the provisional budget, adding \$1,000,000 back into the County Highway budget from the General Fund, died for lack of a second.

MOVED Hadcock and seconded by Petersen to adopt the 2016 Provisional Budget in the amount of \$84,756,844 which includes Miscellaneous Revenues of \$40,696,415, Tax Revenues of \$38,082,922 and Cash Reserves Applied in the amount of \$9,128,296. It was further moved to set a public hearing of the Pennington County Board of Commissioners in the County Administration Building at 130 Kansas City Street, Rapid City, SD, at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, September 1, 2015, for the purpose of considering the Provisional Budget for the year 2016 and the various items, schedules, amounts and appropriations set forth therein and as many days thereafter as is deemed necessary until the final adoption of the budget on or before September 30, 2015. At such time any interested person may appear either in person or by a representative and will be given an opportunity for a full and complete discussion of all purposes, objectives, items, schedules, appropriations, estimates, amounts and matters set forth and contained in the Provisional Budget. Vote: Unanimous.

- b. Reserve Motions: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to dissolve the General Fund Assigned Reserves for Crisis Care Center for \$785,060, the Equipment Reserve for \$36,605 and the Catastrophic Health Care Reserve for \$375,000. It was further moved to establish the General Fund Emergency Indigent Care Assigned Reserve for \$400,000. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to reduce the General Fund Assigned Reserve for IT Equipment by \$13,640 as it is past the 60-month maximum time accumulation. Vote: Unanimous.

RAPID CITY PUBLIC LIBRARY

- A. RURAL LIBRARY SERVICES CONTRACT: MOVED by Hadcock to authorize the Chairperson's signature on letters giving written notice of Board of Commissioners' intent to terminate the existing contract with all libraries that provide rural library services with an effective date of December 31, 2015. The motion died for lack of a second.

MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Petersen that the Chairperson appoint two Commissioners to investigate possibilities for fulfilling library services for Pennington County residents. Vote: Unanimous.

- B. COUNTY LIAISON POSITION TO THE RCPL BOARD OF TRUSTEES: No action was taken on this item.

Commissioner Ferebee left the meeting.

- A. PC CAMPUS EXPANSION PROJECT (BLOCK 99) – RELEASE OF REMAINING RETAINAGE: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Trautman to authorize payment of

\$50,000 of retainage held on the J. Scull Construction Services, Inc., Contract for the construction of the Pennington County Campus Expansion Project. Vote; Unanimous.

Commissioner Ferebee returned to the meeting.

ITEMS FROM EQUALIZATION

A. **ABATEMENT APPLICATIONS:**

Roxy or Tim Dix: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to approve the 2015 abatement for Roxy or Tim Dix, Tax ID 8007888, in the amount of \$33.00. Vote: Unanimous.

Christopher Hargens: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Petersen to approve the 2014 abatement for Christopher Hargens, Tax ID 1776 in the amount of \$307.22. Hadcock and Petersen withdrew their motions after testimony by the Pennington County Treasurer that Mr. Hargens should provide several documents before qualifying for the abatement.

ITEMS FROM HUMAN RESOURCES

A. **AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT – ADA NOTICE:** MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Hadcock that Pennington County adopt the Notice under the Americans with Disabilities Act and instruct the ADA coordinator to follow the guidelines set forth in the agreement with the Department of Justice. Vote: Unanimous.

B. **COMPENSATION COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED INCENTIVE BENEFIT:** The item was presented and will appear on the August 4, 2015, agenda for the Board to take action.

ITEMS FROM HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

A. **AWARD RECOMMENDATION FOR TWO NEW TRACTORS WITH TWIN DECK MOWERS:** MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Ferebee to award two (2) New Tractors with Twin Deck Mowers to RDO Equipment Company, 1540 Deadwood Ave, Rapid City, SD 57702 at a total cost of \$233,508. Vote: Unanimous. Bid documents are on file with the Highway Department.

B. **AWARD RECOMMENDATION FOR ONE NEW ROTARY CUTTER MOWER:** MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Hadcock to award one (1) New Rotary Cutter Mower to Jenner Equipment, PO Box 3102, Rapid City, SD 57709, in the amount of \$19,950. Vote: Unanimous. Bid documents are on file with the Highway Department.

C. **ESTIMATED REPAIR COSTS FOR SOUTH VALLEY DRIVE:** MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to direct the Highway Department to prepare a resolution to include .61 miles of South Valley Drive on the County Highway System as a secondary road.

Substitute Motion: MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Petersen that the Highway Department confirm how much of South Valley Drive, between East Fairmont Boulevard and Elk Vale Road, is outside the city limits of Rapid City. Vote: Unanimous.

THE LAND KNOWN AS PE' SLA: Any and all business related to the request for Commission support of the land to be taken into trust status

A. **CONSIDERATION OF LETTER CONFIRMING THE EXISTENCE OF FIRE AND AMBULANCE SERVICES FOR THE AREA KNOWN AS PE SLA:** MOVED by

Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to authorize the Chairperson's signature on the letter to Tim LaPointe, Regional Director of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Great Plains Region, stating the understandings of the organizations involved in the fire and ambulance service discussion for Pe' Sla. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee voting no.

BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to convene as the Board of Adjustment. Vote: Unanimous.

- A. VARIANCE / VA 15-15: Monte or Nicole Albert. To reduce the minimum required side yard setback from 25 feet to 21 feet for an existing garage and from 25 feet to 3 feet for an existing shed in a Low Density Residential District in accordance with Sections 207 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lot 2, Loveland Canyon Estates, Section 16, T2N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to continue Variance / VA 15-15 to the September 1, 2015, Board of Commissioners' meeting or earlier, if the applicant contacts Planning Department Staff with a desired course of action. Vote: Unanimous.

- B. VARIANCE / VA 15-19: Grace or William Scholl. To reduce the minimum required side yard setback from 25 feet to 5 feet in order to build an addition onto the existing garage in a Low Density Residential District in accordance with Sections 207 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lot 4R, Block 2, Mountain Park Subdivision, Section 5, T1N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Ferebee to approve Variance / VA 15-19 with four (4) conditions. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That this Variance only applies for the proposed eight (8) foot addition to the existing attached garage. All other structures must maintain the proper setback and easement requirements or obtain separate Variance(s);
2. That a Building Permit be obtained prior to construction of the proposed eight (8) foot addition to the existing attached garage, which requires a site plan to be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director;
3. That an approved Floodplain Development Permit is obtained prior to any work being done in the designated floodplain boundaries; and,
4. That the applicant signs the Statement of Understanding within seven (7) business days of approval of Variance / VA 15-19, which is available at the Planning Office.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to adjourn as the Board of Adjustment and reconvene as the Board of Commissioners. Vote: Unanimous.

- C. PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT AMENDMENT REVIEW / PU 06-03: Prairie Valley Development Company, LLC. To review a Planned Unit Development Amendment to allow for 75 residential lots, 1 well lot, and 1 detention lot with a minimum lot size of 1/2 acre in accordance with Section 213 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lots 1-3, Block 1; Lots 1-6, Block 2; Lots 1-10, Block 3; Lots 1-10 and Lot 20, Block 4; Lot 1 and Lot 20, Block 5; Lot 1, Block 6, all of Prairiefire Subdivision; NE1/4NE1/4 Less Eisenbraun Sub, Less Winton Sub, Less Prairiefire Sub and Less ROW; and SE1/4NE1/4 Less Eisenbraun Sub, Less Winton Sub, Less Prairiefire Sub and Less ROW, Section 26, T1N, R8E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

Approve the review of Planned Unit Development Amendment / PU 06-03 with eleven (11) conditions.

1. That the Planned Unit Development consists of no more than 75 residential lots, 1 well lot and 1 detention lot with a minimum lot size of 1/2 acre;
2. That a Building Permit be obtained for any structures exceeding 144 square feet or located on a permanent foundation, which includes the necessary site plans to be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director;
3. That no off-premise signs be allowed within the Planned Unit Development;
4. That the Planning Director may allow additional development or construction which is consistent with the existing development on this property, significant changes in the use or impacts on adjacent land uses as determined by the Planning Director shall require an amendment to this Planned Unit Development;
5. That the required minimum setbacks meet the Suburban Residential Zoning requirements;
6. That each address must be posted in accordance with Pennington County Ordinance Amendment #20;
7. That prior to any new Building Permits located within newly platted areas of the subdivision, the roads providing access to the lots must be improved to city platting requirements and the applicant must install road signs for the new roads;
8. That the Terracotta Homeowner's Association maintains the Central Water System;
9. That the single-family residences must be stick built or double-wide manufactured or modular homes meeting the requirements of Section 204-I of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance;
10. That road widths are 28-foot-wide, with 4-foot to be striped and to be used by pedestrians and non-motorized travel; and,

11. That this Planned Unit Development be reviewed in one (1) year, on a complaint basis, or as deemed necessary by the Pennington County Planning Commission and/or the Board of Commissioners to verify that all Conditions of Approval are being met.

D. VACATION OF EASEMENT / VE 15-03: Grace and William Scholl. To vacate 3 feet of an 8-foot-wide utility and minor drainage easement to allow an addition to be built onto the existing garage.

Lot 4R, Block 2, Mountain Park Subdivision, Section 5, T1N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

Approve Vacation of Easement / VE 15-03 with six (6) conditions.

1. That the resolution for the Vacation of Easement be filed by the applicant with the Register of Deeds;
2. That a Building Permit be obtained for the proposed eight (8) foot addition onto the existing attached garage, which requires a site plan to be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director;
3. That approval of Vacation of Easement #15-03 does not constitute approval of any further applications submitted for the above-described property. Variance / VA 15-19 must be approved by the Board of Adjustment prior to submittal of a Building Permit for the proposed addition to the existing garage;
4. That this Vacation of Easement only applies for the proposed eight (8) foot addition to the existing attached garage. All other structures must maintain the proper setback and easement requirements or obtain separate Variance(s) and/or Vacation(s);
5. That an approved Floodplain Development Permit is obtained prior to any work being done in the designated floodplain boundaries; and,
6. That the applicant signs the Statement of Understanding within seven (7) business days of approval for Vacation of Easement #15-03, which is available at the Planning Office.

E. SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS VARIANCE / SV 15-17: Rodney Alexander; Renner & Associates – Agent. To waive platting requirements in order to create Lots 1 and 2 of Tin City Lode MS 2504 in accordance with Section 700.1 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

Associates – Agent. To rezone 7.615 acres from Highway Service District to Low Density Residential District and to amend the Pennington County Comprehensive Plan to change the Future Land Use from Highway Service District to Low Density Residential District in accordance with Section 508 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.
