

**PENNINGTON COUNTY  
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES  
August 18, 2015**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, August 18, 2015, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building at 130 Kansas City Street, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, George Ferebee and Nancy Trautman.

**APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Ferebee to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

Commissioner Deb Hadcock joined the meeting.

**CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS**

The following items have been placed on the Consent Agenda for action to be taken by a single vote of the Board of Commissioners. Any item may be removed from the Consent Agenda for separate consideration.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Buskerud to remove Item 7 for separate consideration and approve the remaining consent agenda items as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Hadcock to approve the vouchers located at the end of the minutes, with the exception of the Norris Peak Road reconstruction voucher, DOT FHWA, for expenditures for insurance, professional services, publications, rentals, supplies, repairs, maintenance, travel, conference fees, utilities, furniture and equipment totaling \$1,806,582.10. The motion failed 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes, Ferebee – yes, Hadcock – no - Trautman – no, Petersen – no.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to approve the vouchers located at the end of the minutes for expenditures for insurance, professional services, publications, rentals, supplies, repairs, maintenance, travel, conference fees, utilities, furniture and equipment totaling \$1,816,278.78. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee opposing.

**APPOINTMENT RECOMMENDATION TO THE BOARD OF MENTAL ILLNESS – Greg Barnier, Chairman – Pennington County Board of Mental Illness/Review:** MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Trautman to appoint Patricia Meyers to serve a three-year term on the Pennington County Board of Mental Illness/Review. Vote: Unanimous.

**THE LAND KNOWN AS PE SLA - ANY AND ALL BUSINESS RELATED TO THE REQUEST FOR COMMISSION SUPPORT OF THE LAND TO BE TAKEN INTO TRUST STATUS:** MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock that the Pennington County Board of Commissioners submit a letter to the United States Department of the Interior that the work and cooperation by representatives of the tribes is appreciated, and although the Commission has not in the past been in support of taking land off the tax rolls, this is a different situation with sacred designation, and the Commission would not be against the proposal. The motion carried 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – no, Ferebee – no, Hadcock – yes, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

**DUST ABATEMENT/MAG WATER POLICY – COMMISSIONER FEREBEE:** MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Hadcock to allow the Pennington County Highway Superintendent the latitude to spend up to \$10,000 per annum not to exceed five years for mag water and its application on road locations of his choosing to determine the reduction, if any, to road maintenance costs. The motion failed 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – no, Ferebee – yes, Hadcock – yes, Trautman – no, Petersen – no.

**ITEMS FROM AUDITOR**

- A. **GENERAL FUND BUDGET SUPPLEMENT HEARING (SP15-005):** MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to approve a supplement to the General Fund State’s Attorney Witness budget in the amount of \$60,000 from unassigned fund balance. Vote: Unanimous.

A. **ABATEMENT APPLICATIONS**

1. **Lorraine Windenburg:** MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Buskerud to deny the abatement request for Parcel 26097 as the assessment should have been appealed through the Board of Equalization. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee voting no.
2. **Christopher Hargens:** MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Ferebee to approve the 2015 abatement/refund application for Parcel ID 1776 in the amount of \$307.22. Vote: Unanimous.

**ITEMS FROM WEED & PEST**

- A. USFS STEWARDSHIP AGREEMENT: MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to approve the Black Hills National Forest Stewardship Agreement. Vote: Unanimous.

**COUNTY HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT PLANS AND THE BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT GRANT (BIG) FUND – COMMISSION COMMENTS ON ADMINISTRATIVE RULES**: MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to pass the wheel tax at \$5 per wheel for a maximum of 12 wheels and reduce the mill levy by the approximate amount of revenue raised.

The motion maker and second agreed to defer the motion for consideration under Item 20-Any and All Business Relating to the FY2016 Budget.

To rezone 0.17 acre from General Agriculture District to Suburban Residential District and to amend the Pennington County Comprehensive Plan to change the Future Land Use from Planned Unit Development Sensitive to Suburban Residential District in accordance with Section 508 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Trautaman to approve the Second Reading of Rezone / RZ 15-10 and Comprehensive Plan Amendment / CA 15-10. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee opposing.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 508 OF THE PENNINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE, REZONING THE WITHIN DESCRIBED PROPERTY:

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PENNINGTON COUNTY COMMISSION THAT THE PENNINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE BE AND HEREBY IS AMENDED BY AMENDING THE ZONING OF THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED PROPERTY:

Lot 4 (of Gov't Lot 9); Black Forest Village, Section 22, T1N, R5E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

The above-described property is hereby rezoned from General Agriculture District to Suburban Residential District.

- B. MINOR PLAT / PL 15-15: Tipton Properties. To create Lot 1 of Tipton Properties Subdivision in accordance with Section 400.3 of the Pennington County Subdivision Regulations.

EXISTING LEGAL: W1/2 less Sunset Ranch and less Right-of-Way, Section 33, T2N, R10E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

PROPOSED LEGAL: Lot 1 of Tipton Properties Subdivision, Section 33, T2N, R10E, BHM, and Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Trautman to approve Minor Plat / PL 15-15 with six (6) conditions. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee opposing.

1. That prior to the plat being filed with the Register of Deeds, a document dedicating additional Common Area for Planned Unit Development 08-10 be filed at Register of Deeds or a Major PUD Amendment is applied for and approved amending the Common Area acreage requirement of the Planned Unit Development;
2. That prior to the plat being filed with the Register of Deeds, the word “zonig” within the Certificate of Owners section be corrected to state “zoning”; and the use of “Jr.” to the first part of the certificate is to be added, to match the acknowledgment;
3. That prior to the plat being filed with the Register of Deeds, the Certificate of Planning Director be removed from the Minor Plat;
4. That prior to the plat being filed with the Register of Deeds, a Noxious Weed Management Plan must be signed by the applicant and submitted to the Planning Department;
5. That an approved Approach Permit be obtained from the Homeowner’s Association of the Planned Unit Development or County Highway Department prior to the construction of a new approach providing access to the proposed lot; and,
6. That prior to the plat being filed with the Register of Deeds office, the applicants sign the Statement of Understanding within seven (7) business days of approval of Minor Plat / PL 15-15, which is available at the Planning Office.

**WHEREAS**, the Black Hills is experiencing a Mountain Pine Beetle (MPB) outbreak of epidemic proportions; over 430,000 acres of ponderosa pine trees have been infested; and

**WHEREAS**, the current MPB epidemic elevates the risk of catastrophic wildfire risk due to elevating fuel loading from an over-stocked forest; and

**WHEREAS**, thru coordinated and cooperative efforts between Pennington County and the Black Hills National Forest Mystic Ranger District, the Pennington County/USFS Stewardship Agreement was developed, implemented and will continue until the MPB epidemic has become endemic; and

**WHEREAS**, Pennington County has been and continues to be proactive in the MPB fight and remains dedicated to finding ways to protect the lives and property of our residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the stewardship agreement creates shaded fuel breaks along 223 linear arterial miles and strategic road right-of-ways in the Mystic Ranger District that serve as key evacuation routes out of the national forest deemed essential to public and firefighter safety; and

**WHEREAS**, this innovative stewardship agreement is a model example of what can be accomplished thru strong leadership and community partnerships; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Pennington County Board of Commissioners that the Pennington County/Unites States Forest Service Stewardship Agreement and County Weed & Pest Director Scott Guffey who was instrumental in its creation and implementation are hereby nominated for the 2015 County Achievement Award.

**RESOLUTION OF THE PENNINGTON COUNTY COMMISSION NOMINATING THE PENNINGTON COUNTY CAMPUS EXPANSION PROJECT INCLUDING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATION BUILDING**

**WHEREAS**, Pennington County has struggled with space issues for many years due to the growth of the County resulting in changing space needs for both County government and the Unified Judicial Court System; and

**WHEREAS**, the size of the Pennington County Courthouse built in 1921 was no longer adequate to house both County business and a Seventh Circuit Court System; and

**WHEREAS**, Pennington County reached critical mass in 2010 when the Equalization Department was forced to be relocated out of the Courthouse and Pennington County was facing the difficult decision of which office would be the next to be relocated; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2010, Pennington County completed a Facilities Master Plan to understand space needs and identify better ways to serve the residents of the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the most cost effective option identified in the Plan was new construction of an administration building for the County offices and evidence facility on land located next to the Courthouse and Public Safety facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, several years of planning ensued to design the most economical and functional buildings which would stand the test of time and serve the residents of Pennington County well into the future thus the creation of the Pennington County Campus Expansion Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the significant achievement for Pennington County and its citizens from the Expansion Project is all County functions are located in one facility that has potential for future growth and our citizens no longer have to go to different locations to conduct their business. The citizens of Pennington County are benefitting from the innovation and easy accessibility provided by these facilities done so without an increase in property taxes; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Pennington County Board of Commissioners that the Pennington County Campus Expansion Project including the County Administration Building along with the Building Committee, Design Team and County staff who were instrumental in its creation and implementation are hereby nominated for the 2015 County Achievement Award.
