

**PENNINGTON COUNTY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' MINUTES
September 18, 2015**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Friday, September 18, 2015, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building at 130 Kansas City Street, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, George Ferebee, Deb Hadcock and Nancy Trautman.

Commissioner Buskerud presented the Outstanding County Service Award to IT Director Russ Tiensvold.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to remove Item 18, Application for Condemnation of an Easement for Acropolis Holdings, move Items from Planning & Zoning to follow the First Reading of the Wheel Tax Ordinance and approve the agenda as amended. Vote: Unanimous.

CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following items have been placed on the Consent Agenda for action to be taken by a single vote of the Board of Commissioners. Any item may be removed from the Consent Agenda for separate consideration.

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to remove Item 7, Approval of the Vouchers, and approve the consent agenda items as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

ITEMS FROM HEALTH CARE TRUST BOARD

A. **RECOMMENDATION FOR NEW EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (EAP)**

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock that Pennington County Commissioners approve the Health Care Trust Board’s recommendation to change the County’s EAP provider to Connections Inc., effective January 1, 2016, and further moved to increase the 2016 Commissioners’ professional services line item by \$6,000 for the adjusted expense of the new provider. The motion carried 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – no, Ferebee – no, Hadcock – yes, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

FIRST READING AND PUBLIC HEARING OF ORDINANCE NO. 654 – AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A COUNTY WHEEL TAX AND PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION AND COLLECTION THEREOF

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to approve the first reading of Ordinance 654, An Ordinance Imposing a County Wheel Tax and Providing for the Administration and Collection Thereof, which will include up to twelve wheels per vehicle at a rate of \$3 per wheel for trailers and motorcycles, \$4 per wheel for passenger vehicles, trucks, pickups, SUVs and Vans and \$5 per wheel for recreational vehicles and commercial vehicles. The motion carried 4-1 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes, Ferebee – no, Hadcock – yes, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

ITEMS FROM PLANNING AND ZONING - BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Buskerud to convene as the Board of Adjustment. Vote: Unanimous.

- A. **VARIANCE / VA 15-21:** Rodney or Shirley Alexander. To reduce the minimum required lot size from 40 acres to 2.713 acres in a General Agriculture District in accordance with Sections 205 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

- C. VARIANCE / VA 15-23: James and Susan Crossman. To reduce the minimum required front yard setback from 25 feet to 15 feet in order to build a detached garage in a Suburban Residential District in accordance with Sections 208 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lot 3R and Lot 4, Fort Meade Placer MS 244, Section 8, T1N, R6E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Ferebee to approve Variance / VA 15-23 with three (3) conditions. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That this Variance only applies for the portion of the front yard setback requirements that will be encroached upon by construction of the detached garage. All other structures must maintain the proper setback requirements or obtain separate Variance(s) for that structure; and,
2. That prior to submittal of the Building Permit for the proposed detached garage, the applicants obtain approval of the proposed additional approach.
3. That the applicant signs the Statement of Understanding within seven (7) business days of approval of Variance / VA 15-23, which is available at the Planning Office.

D. VARIANCE / VA 15-24: Ronald and Gerri Reynolds; Jeff Howe - Agent. To reduce the minimum required side yard setback from 8 feet to 4 feet in order to build a garage in a Suburban Residential District in accordance with Sections 208 and 509 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.

Lot A of Lot 3 of SE1/4NE1/4, Section 9, T1N, R8E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to approve Variance / VA 15-24 with three (3) conditions. Vote: Unanimous.

1. That this Variance only applies for the proposed detached garage. All other structures must maintain the proper setback and easement requirements or obtain separate Variance(s);
2. That a Building Permit be obtained prior to construction of the proposed detached garage, which requires a site plan to be reviewed and approved by the Planning Director; and,
3. That the applicant signs the Statement of Understanding within seven (7) business days of approval of Variance / VA 15-24, which is available at the Planning Office.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to take a 10 minute break at 11:05 a.m. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to adjourn as the Board of Adjustment and reconvene as the Board of Commissioners. Vote: Unanimous.

CONSIDERATION OF THE FY2016 PROVISIONAL BUDGET AS THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF APPROPRIATIONS, EXPENDITURES AND REVENUES FOR PENNINGTON COUNTY, SD

A. NEW FTE REQUESTS (Continued from September 1, 2015, due to tie votes)
MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to authorize the Treasurer to hire one part time non-benefitted employee. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Petersen to approve three new FTEs in the State's Attorney's Office. The motion failed 3-2 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – no, Ferebee – no, Hadcock – no, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Petersen to approve two new FTEs in the State's Attorney's Office. MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Ferebee to amend the motion and approve one FTE for the State's Attorney. The motion carried 4-1 on a roll call vote: Buskerud – yes, Ferebee – yes, Hadcock – no, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to approve one new FTE for the Public Defender. The motion carried 4-1 with Ferebee voting no.

B. NATIVE SUN NEWS

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Ferebee to not contract with Native Sun for any publications.

Substitute motion: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to maintain publication spending with the Native Sun News at the current level for job advertising.

Substitute motion: MOVED by Ferebee to not publish the minutes in the Native Sun News for 2016. The motion died for lack of a second.

Commissioner Trautman withdrew her substitute motion and Commissioner Ferebee withdrew his second of the original motion, so the original motion failed for lack of a second. This left no motions on the floor.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Hadcock to not publish anything in the Native Sun News except job ads in 2016. The motion carried 4-1 with Buskerud voting no.

C. SUBSIDIES

MOVED by Hadcock and seconded by Buskerud to make no change from the Provisional Budget for subsidies.

Substitute motion: MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Petersen to add funding for WAVI, Front Porch Coalition and Pennington County Conservation Districts.

Substitute motion: MOVED by Ferebee and seconded by Hadcock that the Sheriff, State's Attorney and Health & Human Services each cover \$10,000 for WAVI out of existing budgets. Buskerud called the question: Vote on calling the question: Unanimous.

The vote on the substitute motion carried 3-2 on a call vote: Buskerud – no, Ferebee – yes, Hadcock – no, Trautman – yes, Petersen – yes.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to approve the subsidies for East Pennington Conservation District in the amount of \$36,900 and West Pennington

Conservation District in the amount of \$24,400. The motion carried 3-2 with Ferebee and Hadcock opposing.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Hadcock to confirm that the stored CPI will not be included in the 2016 budget. Substitute motion: MOVED by Ferebee that property taxes not be raised for stored CPI. The substitute motion died for lack of a second. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Buskerud to remove the \$2,206,755 operating transfer from General Fund to the Highway Department. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to reduce the Highway Department budget by \$2,206,755. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by Trautman to reduce the Information Technology Budget by \$9,995. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Buskerud to take a 10 minute break at 12:40 p.m. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Petersen to add \$3,530 to the Commissioner's budget to correct a calculation error. Vote: Unanimous.

MOVED by Trautman and seconded by Petersen to approve following resolution to adopt the 2016 Annual Budget in the amount of \$84,712,601, and the Means of Finance as amended above with the 5% factor at \$3,148,577, Miscellaneous Revenues at \$40,696,415, Reserves of \$9,081,841 and taxes in the amount of \$38,082,922, and further moved to balance any calculation errors with cash reserves. The motion carried 4-1 with Buskerud opposing.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Pennington County Commission that the Adams Street property be sold and ownership transferred to the City of Rapid City as stated herein and that a purchase agreement and quitclaim deed be executed accordingly with the Chairperson and Auditor authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
