

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE PENNINGTON COUNTY  
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
November 17, 2015**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met on Tuesday, November 17, 2015, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following Commissioners present: Ron Buskerud, George Ferebee, Deb Hadcock and Nancy Trautman.

**APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

MOVED by Trautman seconded by Buskerud to approve the agenda as presented. Vote: Unanimous.

**RECOGNITION OF PLANNING STAFF:** Commission Office Manager Holli Hennies announced that Planning Director P.J. Conover and Water Protection Coordinator Brittney Molitor have received certification through the South Dakota Department of Transportation in the field of Erosion and Sediment Control and Storm Water Management. Both have also become Certified Floodplain Managers through the Association of Floodplain Managers and the Certification Board of Regents.
