

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE PENNINGTON COUNTY

January 19, 2016**

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, January 19, 2016, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building, Rapid City, South Dakota. Chairperson Lyndell Petersen called the meeting to order with the following Commissioners present: George Ferebee, Deb Hadcock and Nancy Trautman. Commissioner Ron Buskerud joined by videoconference. Pursuant to SDCL 1-25-1, votes were taken by roll call.

ORDINANCE NO. RZ 15-15

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 508 OF THE PENNINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE, REZONING THE WITHIN DESCRIBED PROPERTY:

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PENNINGTON COUNTY COMMISSION THAT THE PENNINGTON COUNTY ZONING ORDINANCE BE AND HEREBY IS AMENDED BY AMENDING THE ZONING OF THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED PROPERTY:

A Parcel of land being described for Rezone from General Agriculture to Low Density Residential, located in the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter (SW¹/₄ – NE¹/₄) less the East 54.4 feet of Section 26, Township One North (T1N), Range Eight East (R8E), Black Hills Meridian (BHM), Pennington County, South Dakota. The Point of Beginning of said parcel being common with the southwesterly corner of the Mondo Street right-of-way as shown in Plat Book 34, Page 104, at the Pennington County Register of Deeds Office, which is marked by a 5/8” rebar with survey cap stamped “Thingelstad SD RLS 4371”, said Parcel is more particularly described as follows: THENCE FIRST COURSE: along said east 54.4 feet line of the SW ¹/₄ of the NE ¹/₄ with a bearing of S00°04’51”W and a distance of 382.83 feet to the southeasterly corner of said parcel; THENCE SECOND COURSE: along a line with a bearing

of N89°51'55"W and a distance of 450.00 feet to the southwesterly corner of said parcel; THENCE THIRD COURSE: along a line with a bearing of N00°04'51"E and a distance of 290.40 feet; THENCE FOURTH COURSE: along a line with a bearing of S89°51'55"E and a distance of 355.65 feet; THENCE FIFTH COURSE: along said a line with a bearing of N00°04'51"E and a distance of 92.34 feet; THENCE SIXTH COURSE: along a line with a bearing of S89°55'09"E and a distance of 94.35 feet to the Point of Beginning. Basis of Bearings established by GPS observation (WGS84.) Said Parcel of Land Contains 3.20 acres, more or less; located off of Mondo Street, Section 26, T1N, R8E, BHM, Pennington County, South Dakota, in accordance with Section 508 of the Pennington County Zoning Ordinance.
