PROCEEDINGS OF THE PENNINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS January 3, 2017

The Pennington County Board of Commissioners met at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, January 3, 2017, in the Commission Chambers in the County Administration Building, Rapid City, South Dakota. Vice Chairman Deb Hadcock called the meeting to order with the following Commissioners and Commissioners-elect present: Ron Buskerud, Mark DiSanto, George Ferebee and Lloyd LaCroix.

OATHS OF OFFICE

Honorable Judge Jeff Davis administered the oath of office to Commissioner Lloyd LaCroix. Peggy Napoli, Public Notary, administered the oath of office to Commissioner Mark DiSanto.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Vice Chairman Deb Hadcock opened the floor for nominations for chair.

MOVED by Buskerud to nominate Commissioner Hadcock for Chairman.

MOVED by Ferebee to nominate Commissioner DiSanto for Chairman.

MOVED by LaCroix and seconded by DiSanto that nominations cease. The motion carried.

The Board of Commissioners agreed 3-2 to vote verbally.

The 2017 Chairman is Commissioner Deb Hadcock on a 3-2 roll-call vote: Buskerud – Hadcock, DiSanto – DiSanto, Ferebee – DiSanto, Hadcock – Hadcock, LaCroix – Hadcock.

MOVED by LaCroix and seconded by Buskerud to vote verbally for Vice Chairman. The motion carried 3-2 with DiSanto and Ferebee voting no.

MOVED by Hadcock to nominate Commissioner LaCroix for Vice Chairman.

MOVED by Ferebee to nominate Commissioner Mark DiSanto for Vice Chairman.

MOVED by LaCroix and seconded by DiSanto that nominations cease. The motion carried.

The motion carried.

ESTABLISH COMMISSIONERS' SALARY

MOVED by DiSanto and seconded by LaCroix to set the 2017 salary for Commissioners at the same rate as 2016 or \$1500 per month. The motion carried.

REVIEW AND APPROVE AGENDA

MOVED by Buskerud and seconded by LaCroix to approve the agenda as presented.

9. Approve the Resolution for the Drug Free Workplace Act Certification for a Public Entity for 2017.

2017 RESOLUTION DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE ACT CERTIFICATION FOR A PUBLIC ENTITY

- 1. The County of Pennington, SD certifies that it will provide a drug-free workplace by:
 - a. Publishing a statement notifying employees that unlawfully manufacturing, distributing, dispensing, possessing or using a controlled substance in the recipient's workplace is prohibited and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violation or such prohibition.
 - b. Establishing a drug-free awareness program to inform employees about:
 - 1. The dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 - 2. The recipient's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
 - 3. Any drug counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs that are available; and
 - 4. The penalties that may be imposed upon employees for drug abuse violations occurring in the workplace.
 - c. Making it a requirement that each employee to be engaged in the performance of the grant or cooperative agreement be given a copy of the statement required by paragraph (a).

- d. Notifying the employee in the statement required by paragraph (a) that, as a condition of employment under the grant or cooperative agreement, the employee will;
 - 1. Abide by the terms of the statement; and,
 - 2. Notify the employer of any criminal drug statute conviction for a violation occurring in the workplace no later than five days after such a conviction.
- e. Notifying the federal sponsoring agency within ten days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d) (2), with respect to any employee so convicted;
 - 1. Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
 - 2. Requiring such an employee to participate satisfactorily in drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency.
- f. Taking one of the following actions, within 30 days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee so convicted;
 - 1. Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination; or
 - 2. Requiring such an employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State or local health, law enforcement, or other agency.
- g. Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).
