



EXHIBIT B

STANDARD SPECIFICATION FOR COUNTY APPROACHES





The above Typical Approach Detail will be followed in the construction of roads within Public right-of-ways under the jurisdiction of Pennington County. Road construction materials and methods will conform to the current published edition of the "Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges" of the South Dakota Department of Transportation, when referenced in the standards below. A copy of these Specifications is on file at the County Highway Department Office.

The following are standards, which will be met:

- 1. Maximum grade on an approach will not exceed five percent (5%) within the right-of-way.
- Culverts will be sized to ensure proper drainage. The minimum size of culvert will be eighteen inches (18") in diameter. Fifteen inches (15") in diameter may be allowed under certain conditions with written approval from the County Highway Department designee. The minimum culvert length will be thirty feet (30').
- 3. Gravel surfacing will meet the requirements of "Part B. Section 260, Granular Bases and Surfacing" of the current published edition of the "Standard Specifications for Roads and Bridges", South Dakota Department of Transportation. The minimum depth will be four inches (4") with a minimum traveled roadway width of twenty feet (20') for residential and twenty-eight feet (28') for commercial and industrial up to the right-of-way line.
- 4. Approaches will be constructed perpendicular, as practical, to the County Road.
- 5. Only one (1) approach per residence will be allowed unless authorized by the County Highway Superintendent or designee.
- 6. Additional approaches for commercial, industrial and agriculture will be reviewed on a case by case basis by the County Highway Superintendent or designee.
- 7. Sight distance of approaches will meet the standards in the current published edition in the AASHTO guide.
- 8. Ditches and right-of-way will follow specifications as set forth in Ordinance 11 for erosion control and seeding.
- 9. Temporary approaches must be removed within one year of approach permit approval unless an extension is granted by the Highway Superintendent or designee upon written request of the applicant.



APPROACH PERMIT APPLICATION PROCEDURE/CHECKLIST

- Verify that Pennington County has jurisdiction/authority to grant approach permit (see attached flow chart)
- Complete Approach Permit Application Form
- Provide a vicinity map, showing the approach location in relation to the property boundaries and/or nearby road intersections (see attached for an example)
- □ Provide any other supporting documentation (i.e. plats showing property lines, access easement documents, etc.)
- □ Pay \$250 application fee (cash, check or credit card payments accepted) Only *Visa, MasterCard and Discover credit cards are accepted and ALL credit card transactions are subject to a non-refundable service fee of 2.49% or minimum of \$1.50.*
- ☐ Mark proposed location of approach on site with lathe, flags, ribbon or other (not applicable for permitting existing approaches)
- □ Highway Department staff will then conduct a site visit to assess drainage, sight distance and determine if Ordinance 14 standards can be met or are met for existing approaches

New Construction or Applicant's Request to Make Improvements/Changes to Existing Approach


- Highway Department staff contact applicant with initial inspection results
- □ Applicant must post \$2,500 surety deposit with Highway Department (cash or cashier's check ONLY)
- □ Permit approved upon receipt of surety deposit, construction may begin
- □ Upon completion of construction, applicant must notify Highway Department to schedule final inspection (605-394-2166 or pchd@pennco.org)
- ☐ Highway Department staff will then conduct final inspection
- □ Highway Department staff will contact applicant to notify them of final inspection status if improvements need to be made or if approved as constructed
- Once final inspection approved, surety deposit will be released to applicant through Auditor's Office

Existing Construction – No Changes or Improvements Requested by Applicant

- Highway Department staff contact applicant with initial inspection results
- □ If Ordinance 14 standards are met, Highway Department Staff will complete final inspection without requiring the surety deposit for construction
- □ If Ordinance 14 standards are <u>not</u> met and the existing approach must be improved, applicant must post \$2,500 surety deposit (cash or cashier's check ONLY)
- Permit approved upon receipt of surety deposit, construction may begin
- □ Upon completion of construction, applicant must notify Highway Department to schedule final inspection (605-394-2166 or pchd@pennco.org)
- ☐ Highway Department staff will then conduct final inspection
- □ Highway Department staff will contact applicant to notify them of final inspection status if improvements need to be made or if approved as constructed
- Once final inspection approved, surety deposit will be released to applicant through Auditor's Office
